- Learn how to simultaneously diagnose dysfunction and apply quick and efficient techniques when treating patients.

- Review of the most recent updated guidelines, with a focus on prevention, detection, and the clinical benefits of rhythm control on reducing cardiovascular morbidity when given a diagnosis of atrial fibrillation.
- Develop an approach to common problems and routine health maintenance in men's health.
- Equip non-psychiatrist healthcare professionals with essential insights and strategies for enhancing their approach to psychiatric conditions, promoting holistic patient care and treatment success.

- Navigate a landscape of emerging antimicrobial resistance which may change our initial empiric antibiotic selections.
- Rediscover the passion that led you to medicine and the perseverance that pushed you through it, then learn ways to instill a growth mindset in future physicians.



Dr. Ward E. Perrin graduated from the Chicago College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1943. As a young faculty member at CCOM, he taught at Midwestern University's CE program for alumni in September 1947. Dr. Perrin then organized, coordinated, and taught at all CE programs for the next 54 years. Under his leadership, the CE program was renamed the Clinical Refresher Course and expanded beyond college alumni to welcome guests and lecturers from beyond the osteopathic profession. In 1987, the American Medical Association approved accreditation for the Clinical Refresher Course, and the CE program became open to all practicing physicians, both D.O. and M.D. The Clinical Refresher Course was the first CE program hosted by an osteopathic school to receive this distinction.
